

# Missing Letters

Use these word and picture cards to play a few different games - in all the games, you'll need to find the missing letters.

## You will need:

- Word Cards (included in this resource)
- Picture Cards (included in this resource)
- A4 thin card or paper
- scissors

## Instructions

1. Print out the word cards and picture cards onto A4 thin card or paper.
2. Carefully, cut out the cards (an adult might need to do this).
3. If possible, laminate the cards or cover them in sticky-back plastic to make them more durable.
4. Then, have a go at one of the following activities.



## Ways to Play

### Match the Cards

- Lay out the cards and try matching the words to the pictures.
- Write the missing letters onto the word cards.
- If you've laminated the cards, you could use a dry wipe pen so you can wipe off the letters and play again another time.

### Memory Game

- Lay out the word cards face down in one group.
- Then, lay out the picture cards face down in another group.
- Turn over one word card and one picture card.
  - If they match, can you fill in the missing letters? Then, keep that pair of cards to one side for yourself.
  - If they don't match, turn them back over but try to remember where they are.
- You can play this memory game on your own or with other people. If you're playing with others, the person with the most pairs at the end of the game wins.



## Snap

- This is a good game for two players.
- Shuffle the cards and deal them into two equal piles, face down.
- Take it in turns to turn over the top card on your pile.
- If you see that two cards match, say 'Snap!'
- You'll then need to fill in the missing letters on the word card before you can claim the pair.
- The person with the most pairs at the end of the game wins.
